

Transfer Welcome Registration: Important Information for Parents and Students

Welcome to Serra! We will be sharing a lot of information with you this evening. Some key topics are addressed in this overview, with information on how to get additional details or answers to your questions. Please note that, in some cases, additional information will be sent to you by traditional mail or email. Watch for these communications, and be sure your email is set to recognize Junípero Serra High School.

Physical Examination and Immunization Requirements In order to have your son begin classes in August, he must have on file at Serra the appropriate verified documentation for his completed physical examination and immunization record.

Physical Exam: Every incoming student must submit a medical form that documents a physical exam within the last year by **Friday, July 1**, **2022**. Please download the *Preparticipation Physical Evaluation Form*, which includes a medical history to be completed by parents and a physician's evaluation to be completed, signed and stamped by a licensed medical physician. **Serra must receive the completed** *Preparticipation Physical Evaluation Form***, July 1, 2022.**

• Incoming students not planning to participate in athletics during the school year: Please scan and email the completed form to <u>admissions@serrahs.com</u>. You also can bring a hard copy into our main office or mail it to us.

• Incoming students who plan to participate in a Serra team sport anytime during the school year: Go to <u>www.athleticclearance.com</u> to create an account (make sure to click on 2022-23 school year and click on the correct school: Junipero Serra/San Mateo) and complete the online clearance process. You will upload your completed form to your online account or email your physical form to Athletic Director Justin Ferdinand at <u>jferdinand@serrahs.com</u>.

Important Note: The California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), the governing body for high school sports in California, requires that student-athletes have a current annual physical examination, or statement by a medical practitioner, certifying they are physically fit to participate in athletics before they are eligible to try out, practice or participate in interscholastic athletic competition. The date of the certification must be within 365 days of the completion of the sports season. **Immunization Records:** You are required to provide us with a copy of your son's most current official immunization record. It must include proof of the Tdap booster shot required of all California students. Immunization records should be emailed to <u>admissions@serrahs.com</u> by **July 1, 2022**.

Serra complies with the immunization regulations of the State of California and the Archdiocese of San Francisco, for all freshmen and transfer students. California School Immunization Law (Health and Safety Code Sections 120335-120375) and the Archdiocese of San Francisco require that no registering pupil shall be admitted to school unless and until the parents (a) have established the required record of immunizations received by the student, (b) presented a statement of medical exemption, or (c) have filed an affidavit, prior to January 1, 2016, stating beliefs opposed to immunizations. Required Summer Homework Summer homework is an important way for students to retain the skills and knowledge developed over the school year and help with the smooth transition into a new school. Students should expect to be evaluated on their summer work at the beginning of the school year.

- Math all students will have math homework over the summer (regardless of what level math they are placed in). Math homework will be available by logging on to PCR (after June 1).
- English It is expected that students will have completed the required summer reading prior to the first day of classes in August. Classes and grade levels dictate what the assignments are. Summer reading directions and selections are located on the Serra website under academics or <u>here</u>. They will also be available through PCR (after June 1).

Required Summer Technology Orientation Incoming students are required to complete a technology orientation program in the summer before they begin at Serra. The purpose of this program is for students to:

- set up the necessary accounts and passwords for the various technology applications they will be using as Serra students.
- familiarize and practice technology skills required of all Serra students.
- review and discuss the school's expectations as they relate to technology usage and online behavior.

Dates will be announced and sign-ups open beginning in June. Look for an email at the beginning of June with instructions about how to log in to PCR (the parent/student portal). Once you are in PCR, you will be able to sign up for a tech orientation.

Course Progression and Graduation Requirements All students will take a minimum of six classes during the year. These include English, math, history, science, theology and a world language. The level of English, history, science and math will depend on placement. Students also will select an elective class or an independent study period; a small group of students will be placed in a Directed Study class.

You can review the four-year course progression, UC/CSU course requirements, and Serra's graduation requirements in the PCR Parent Portal. Click "Student Information" and then "Scheduling Next Year" to locate the information. You can also find the Junípero Serra High School Graduation Requirements/UC Admissions/CSU Admissions document on the <u>Welcome and Registration page</u> under "Graduation Plan".

Ordering Textbooks Books can be ordered online through <u>MBS direct</u> beginning in July. Books should not be ordered until you receive your class list (end of June). MBS direct often has used books available for sale (if a physical book is required) but they sometimes go quickly so if you are interested in used books, order early.

Some courses use online textbooks, some use physical textbooks and some use a combination or let students decide Each teacher makes independent decisions about what material best supports his/her class.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program Students are *required* to bring a portable internet access device (e.g. Mac or PC laptop, newer Chromebook) to school daily. The program allows students to access internet resources as needed on campus and in-classroom curriculum. The BYOD model holds particular advantages for Serra students. Not only does the program respond to the personal device preferences of students and their families, but it also replicates the environment students will encounter in college classrooms.

Minimum device requirements and examples of acceptable portable devices can be found on the Serra website - <u>serrahs.com</u>. Click the "Academics" tab on the website's homepage, then select "Technology" from the pulldown menu.
